WHERE POLLUTION COMES FROM

MOTOR VEHICLES are the fastest-growing source of air pollution today, pumping out a toxic mixture of health-threatening pollutants. Traffic fumes are largely responsible for the increasing number of smog's which pollute our towns, cities and rural areas.
